Safety First!

Hello fellow members, I hope everyone has been having a great summer with lots of flying involved as the resealed runway and new striping look amazing.

Unfortunately, I have noticed some safety concerns that should be addressed as the possibility of an accident is something no one wants to think about.

When you are alone at the field it is possible to fly from the runway or approach if you desire as you are the only one there. However, when others are present pilots should use the designated pilot boxes. We are looking into getting some new netting for the surrounding fences, but the areas are still valid. This not only allows you to fly without having to move to take off or land but also allows others to do the same without having to ask you to move or wonder where you are during flight operations.

When taking off, landing, or during any close maneuvers, announce your intentions loudly so that others are not surprised by your actions. If you need to step onto or cross the runway while others are flying, make sure they know your intentions.

Fly within your limits. Planes can be small and very fast such that they disappear quickly. So, if you have trouble tracking your plane, keep it close so that you know what it is doing and can make the appropriate corrections when needed.

Safety above all else should be the main concern of all pilots. It is better to intentionally ground and lose an airplane than to take the chance of injuring someone.

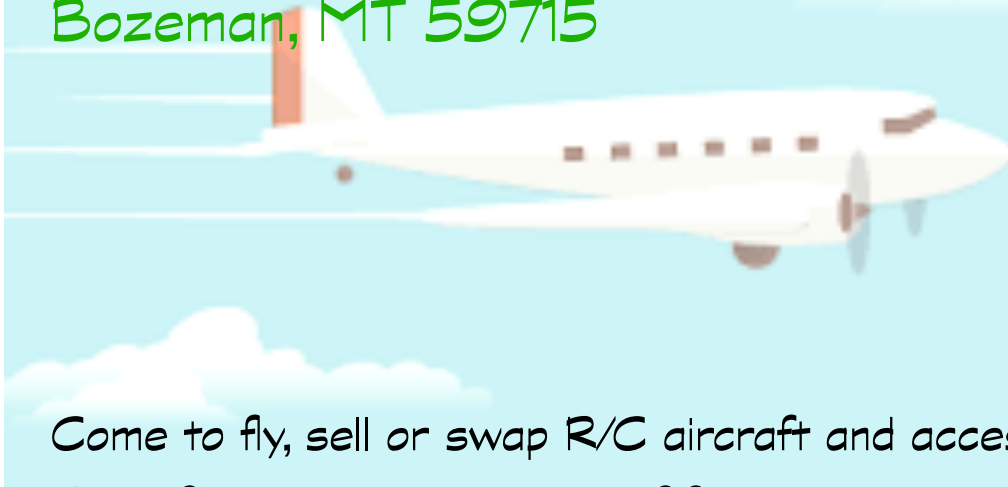
Note: Please do not leave personal airplanes or other gear in the club house unless they're being donated to the club.
