## Tools

The longer one builds, the more tools accumulate. When I started at age 6, I had only double-edged razor blades. Not a good tool for cutting out parts. I have one tool left from my control line days in the early 50's - a glow plug wrench.

Top of the list is Xacto knives and the most common is the #11 blade. They are available in boxes of 100. Not cheap but a box will last a very long time. I like the rubber handled knife handle for the #11. The larger knife handle will take the long blades - #X226 - which has 2" of blade length. Hard to find and I buy them when I see them. Good for carving. The #11's in boxes of 100 are at Owenhouse.

Speaking of carving - the best carving knife I have came from the house wares section of Owenhouse. It's a RADA with a stainless steel 5" blade and a cast aluminum handle. I've had mine several years and have never had to sharpen it. Trust Ron to buy good stuff there.

I have two band saws - one for metal cutting and a table top model with a wood cutting blade. I'd be hard put to do without the table top model. I also have a table top drill press.

Sanders - I have two. One is a 12" diameter and will sand wood as well as metal. The other is home made with a 4" disc and a foot switch to run it. I plan to build two more (if I can find the motors).

Screwdrivers - get the best you can afford. A battery powered drill and a full set of drill bits are indispensable. Also, a variety of 1/2" bits will come in handy.

Almost everything you need for tools can be found at Owenhouse or they can order it. Another good place to look for tools is the MSU bookstore. A really good place for cutting mats and cutting tools is Jo Anns in the mall. They have some great scissors.

Small tools are available in a lot of places. Just keep your eyes open.
